Paul Jensen out of NY used a combination of Hoving (2001) and Krohn et al (2004) to map mean annual snowfall in NY. So it seems that the best datasets out there are still Hoving and Krohn and would be your best option to contact for this data.

Hi Jill,

I got your voicemail from yesterday. Yes, you are correct, the primary purpose of my call last week was to run through the items that were addressed in Dan's email from Monday. The only other item I wanted to touch base on was the inclusion of NHFG's 2012 data on lynx and marten observations to the Natural Heritage Bureau database - I contacted Melissa Coppola at NHNH to check the status of that input but hadn't heard back from her. We'd like to prepare our data request to NHB so that we can get the updated data included in our model for this year's surveys, but I don't want to submit that request until we know we'll get the complete data set so that we can avoid a second submittal later on. Any update you have on that data would be really helpful.

Sorry about the delay in getting some of this information to you I wanted to do some research on our data sharing policy before doing so.

I think I will just ask that:

Any data that we provide is for the use of ecology and environment for the Northern Pass project only. Please do not copy, distribute or make the data available to any other parties without our consent.

Note that the data and model created from the data has some age to it, and therefore cannot be considered the most up to date in some instances.

Please do not modify the data in anyway except to make compatible with your GIS.

Proper citation for the marten data should be:
